Willow Emerald Damselfly	<i>Chalcolestes viridis</i>	scarce
Large Red Damselfly	<i>Pyrrhosoma nymphula</i>	scarce
Blue-tailed Damselfly	<i>Ischnura elegans</i>	common
Common Blue Damselfly	<i>Enallagma cyathigerum</i>	common
Azure Damselfly	<i>Coenagrion puella</i>	common
Red-eyed Damselfly	<i>Erythromma najas</i>	scarce
Small Red-eyed Damselfly	<i>Erythromma viridulum</i>	scarce
Hairy Dragonfly	<i>Brachytron pratense</i>	scarce
Brown Hawker	<i>Aeshna grandis</i>	rare
Southern Hawker	<i>Aeshna cyanea</i>	common
Migrant Hawker	<i>Aeshna mixta</i>	common
Norfolk Hawker	<i>Aeshna isoceles</i>	vagrant; just one which lingered on Cley Marshes in 2019
Emperor Dragonfly	<i>Anax imperator</i>	common
Lesser Emperor Dragonfly	<i>Anax parthenope</i>	vagrant
Vagrant Emperor Dragonfly	<i>Hemianax ephippiger</i>	vagrant; just one reported in 2019
Broad-bodied Chaser	<i>Libellula depressa</i>	scarce
Four-spotted Chaser	<i>Libellula quadrimaculata</i>	common
Keeled Skimmer	<i>Orethetrum coerulescens</i>	vagrant
Black-tailed Skimmer	<i>Orthetrum cancellatum</i>	common
Common Darter	<i>Sympetrum striolatum</i>	common
Red-veined Darter	<i>Sympetrum fonscolombii</i>	scarce
Yellow-winged Darter	<i>Sympetrum flaveolum</i>	vagrant; just one on Blakeney Point on 19 th August 2005
Ruddy Darter	<i>Sympetrum sanguineum</i>	common
